

Flea Treatment Preparation Sheet

INTERIOR FLEA TREATMENT:

Residents and pets must be out of the home for <u>3 hours</u> after service is performed.

- Clear all carpeted floors including closets of boxes, clothing and any other items that will
 prevent treatment.
- Place pet food dishes and children's toys in protected area.
- VACUUM All floors, carpets, rugs, and furniture (between and under cushions), pet sleeping
 and resting areas, cracks and crevices in floors, and draperies. Empty contents of the vacuum
 cleaner into a plastic bag. <u>IMMEDIATELY</u> dispose of the bag in an outside container.
- Mop all tile, laminate, vinyl, hardwood floors.
- Wash (in hot water) or destroy all pet bedding. If bedding is put into trash, put into sealable plastic bag and dispose of into an exterior trash container.
- Dogs and cats should be treated by a vet or vet-approved flea control product at the same time your home is treated.
- Remove birds from home. Shut off air in fish tanks and cover aquariums and fish bowls.

AFTER TREATMENT IS COMPLETE:

- Wash (with soap and water) ALL exposed eating surfaces (including tables and counter tops) and any exposed dishes and silverware.
- **DO NOT** clean the carpet or floors with detergents or cleaners for at least two weeks after treatment is complete (doing so will void any warranty).
- Vacuum DAILY for two weeks. Be sure to dispose of the bag after each vacuuming in an exterior trash bin.
- Do not be alarmed if you see some fleas after the treatment. These fleas are newly hatched and will be killed by the residual effects from the treatment.
- Please wait 14 days for the full effect of the treatment. If after 14 days there is still activity, call
 for a re-treatment before the 30 day warranty expires. Severe infestations may require followup visits.
